This Addendum is in responses to the site visit held on July 16, 2008 at Ferndale Preserve and P.E.A.R park.

1. Question: How many contracts per site.

Answer: There will be one contract for both sites, Ferndale Preserve and P.E.A.R park

2. Question: The proposed fishing pier site appears to be in the area of cultural/historical resources as are some of the trails will we choose to mitigate or relocate amenities in these cases?

Answer: Relocate the amenities

3. Question: Dimensions of multi-purpose trail footprint, Ferndale Preserve

Answer: Trail footprint 18'
Pavilions 30x30
Restrooms 20x20
Structures 30x30

4. Question: Land restoration activities need to minimize site disturbance, concerns regarding the uprooting of large trees that may disturb artifacts.

Answer: Trees will be cut of at ground level and herbicided. No bulldozing.

5. Question: Pear Park, impacted areas are?

Answer: paved multi-purpose trail, 18'
Paved entry road 50'
Tennis courts and pickleball 200x200 square ft.

6. Question: request for Ed Eckstein's remarks included in the Addendum

Answer: To Wendy Poag, "We do not really require a survey of an entire project site unless the whole site contains artifacts or features. If a Phase I was done and there were hot spots on the site you should likely survey those areas.
Our bottom line is that areas that will be disturbed by any construction should be assessed for historic resources and found resources need to be protected. I know that Ferndale Preserve had some features but I believe that P.E.A.R. Park did not have any...you may want to check the original application or FCT management plan for each site. Some of these sites are very large and there is likely no need to intensely survey several hundred acres. I would say consider what is on the site, the site size, etc. and use your best judgment to determine what part of the site should be surveyed. Hope this helps. Ed"

7. Canoe launch not in correct location on site map.

Answer: It is within the front 50 acres as is the old RR Bridge.

8. Requested additional time to prepare response.
