Boy & Girls Club of Lake-Sumter

\$25,000.00

Fit Program is a dynamic approach to nutrition education and physical fitness for children and youth that may be at risk of health problems due to poor nutrition habits or lack of physical fitness activities. The project seeks to increase knowledge of fundamental nutrition principles and commitment to regular physical activity by BGC members served by the project.

Central Florida YMCA

\$14,040.00

Golden Triangle YMCA's Youth Achievers Performing Arts Program will be collaboration between Golden Triangle and Eustis Heights Elementary in an effort to expose African American member in the Youth Achievers program to the Performing Arts, such as cultural dances. One of the health benefits of this program is students will enhance their physical fitness by performing these ancient forms of dance. This fund will expand the number of students participating in the Youth Achievers program from twenty-five to fifty.

Christian Care Center

\$21,362.00

Pregnancy Care Center endeavors to improve parenting skills for those at risk of abusing or neglecting their children. Areas addressed are nutritional education and obesity reduction, academic success and school dropout reduction, physical and inner fitness, encouraging positive life choices, healthy approaches to discipline and child abuse reduction.

Early Learning Coalition

\$25,000.00

The primary mission of ELC is to ensure that every child is ready to learn by kindergarten. The Big Blue Bus is a mobile resource bus, which provides resources training and services to providers, family and children that are at-risk to participate in early education training. An Early Childhood Specialist/Bus Driver, employed by the ELC, provides the services.

Haven of Lake & Sumter Counties

\$25,000.00

Safe Alternatives for Violence Exposed Kids (SAVE Kids) provides a safe environment and effective interventions for children exposed to Domestic Violence (DV). Problem areas caused by exposure to family violence are identified through professional interviewing and assessment.



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Jeppesen VisionQuest

\$10,000.00

Pre-K Vision Intervention Project provides free vision exams and vision intervention services to primarily economically disadvantaged children enrolled in Pre-K.

Lady Lake Police Department

\$25,000.00

Annual Children's Holiday Program identifies those in the community less fortunate by providing food, clothing and gifts. They will distribute bicycles, helmets and sport balls for disadvantaged children. Children and families will have the opportunity to attend, and participate, in the 25th anniversary celebration.

Lake-Sumter Children's Advocacy Center

\$25,000.00

Therapeutic Creative Arts Play Therapy Program Provide therapeutic services to children who have been physically and/or sexually abused. By utilizing group participation, it will help alleviate the waiting list of children who are in need of these services. The idea is to place children in a setting where they are in charge, and help them work out their issues through safe and guided therapeutic play situations. This way children process and deal with abuse issues before they lead to additional risk behaviors.

Lake-Sumter Community College

\$ 5,000.00

Single Parent Project is a program to provide assistance to single parents by assisting with tuition, books and supplies. This is to encourage single parents to pursue a college certificate or degree. The long term of providing assistance to single parents is to improve family economics and establish academic role models for children in the family.

Leesburg Art Festival

\$11,084.00

Arts Enrichment Initiative works cooperatively with the Boys and Girls Club of Lake and Sumter Counties to expose economically disadvantaged and at-risk children from Lake County in grades 3-8 to Cultural Arts. The Leesburg Art Center will identify students who are artistically disposed, and provide intensive, ongoing training in the arts for thirty students.



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LifeStream Behavioral Center

\$25,000.00

Child Care Choice Services Subsidized Child Care Program assist each family by determining their eligibility for services, and providing resource and referral information so a parent can choose services that are most appropriate for their child. The early care and educational services, which include subsidized childcare, monitor each child's full development and provides training opportunities for parents, families and child care workers.

Provides an After School Enrichment Program, which includes tutoring, homework assistance, recreation, cooking and crafts. These services are provided free to children of school age three days a week.
