Submit a typewritten speech, double-spaced on 8.5 x 11 inch white paper, with a one inch margin. Speech must be typed using a standard font no greater than a size 12. Provide a cover page with the contestant's name, speech title, parent or guardian name, home address, home telephone number, email address, and school name.

Eligibility

This contest is open to any Lake County students in grades six through twelve.

Entries in the Lake County competition will be evaluated locally. The winner of the local competition qualifies to be entered in an area competition, and from there may advance to a State competition.

Note to Teachers - Participation in this event would directly relate to Sunshine State Standards, Language Arts, LA.C.3.4.1 AND LA.C.3.4.2. If used as a class assignment, please choose three speeches to submit from one class.

Contest Rules

One Contest Topic - "**HARDWORKING POLLINATORS - WHY ARE THEY LOCAL HEROES?**"

Speeches must be original, not previously used, and created by the contestant. Contestant may use notes while speaking; but no form of audio or visual aids. Contestant may not wear attire that will identify them with any organization (FFA, 4-H, or school logos).

Time Limit – Speeches must be a minimum of six minutes; but not greater than eight minutes in length. **Time under or over these limits, respectively, will result in two points for each 15 second increment or part thereof.**

Judging – Prior to the oral presentation date, three impartial judges and a timekeeper will be selected. A standard score sheet will be used for all contestants. The judge's decisions will be final. Judges will score entries based on the following criteria:
